We also partnered with New Life Assembly in Sioux Lookout and their youth pastor to send four boys to a youth conference in Winnipeg. The boys mentioned that they enjoyed meeting

new kids from different communities. We are doing another VBS this summer in August with a mission team from Barrie, On. We are so excited to have them come and serve with us this summer!

#### **Moms Helping Moms**

Last year we handed out 37 Baby Bundles to new moms. This year we have handed out 27, so far! Originally, these bundles were being distributed to mothers from fly-in reservations, but now we have begun to also distribute in our own community of Lac Seul. These bundles give us the opportunity to meet new mothers and to connect with them. Thank-you to everyone who has supported this growing project!
